Nick Scott will be a guest speaker on bullying, perseverance, and gratitude for all students on Tuesday. Mr. Countryman has addressed issues on campus with Vapor Pen/E-Cigarette. The QJSHS staff is looking at what needs to be done in order for them to lead the state in the success of our students. Mrs. Countryman has finished testing 7th-10th grade students using the Aspire test. Results of the ACT testing showed an increase in student's scores. Student/Staff Successes: Rebekah Kitch and Abria Fisher were honored as Kansas Honors Scholars last month in Colby; Evie Gruenbacher, Codi Kentner and Kourtney Davidson were honored as Junior Class Scholars by Wichita State University; Jonathan Jacka ran a personal record at state cross country finishing 55 of 91 runners;

Mrs. Kephart reported the 2017 Mathematics Standards have been released and shared the implementation timeline and impact on mathematics instruction. Mrs. Kephart presented a junior high sports practice budget and student achievement concerns with having elementary teachers coaching junior high sports during the school day along with problems it is causing at the QJSHS.

Superintendent's Report:

Career and Technology Education weightings survey results show differentiating weighting won't generate much more money. A statewide cap on bonded debt limits the number of bonds that can be approved each year. Several bonds were voted down in the recent election which may allow districts on the waiting list to hold a bond election in the Spring. Committees the state level are studying: procurement, health benefits and other efficiencies. Legislators asked KSDE to survey districts how local boards would spend additional funding over the next three years. Mrs. Kephart recognized Tara Thornburg with a certificate from Kansas Association of School Boards for acquiring at least 25 Leadership Academy points, and Toby Countryman received from Kansas Association of Secondary School Principals the Area V High School Principal of the Year honors. Mr. Countryman was selected by his peer principals.
